ELECTION LAW CHANGES BEGINNING MARCH 28, 2013

PA 523 of 2012 takes effect **March 28, 2013** and includes several election law changes. Of particular importance is the new requirement for voters to present identification or sign the *Affidavit of Voter Not in Possession of Picture Identification* form when **registering to vote** or **obtaining an absentee ballot** <u>in person</u>.

Acceptable forms of identification are listed below (MCL 168.523 for voter identification requirement.):

Voters with picture ID: Voters can satisfy the ID requirement by showing a Michigan driver's license or a Michigan personal identification card.

Voters who do not possess either document may show any of the following forms of picture ID as long as it is current:

- Driver's license or personal ID card issued by another state.
- Federal or state government-issued photo ID.
- U.S. passport.
- Military identification card with photo.
- Student identification with photo from a high school or an accredited institution of higher education.
- Tribal identification card with photo.

Voters without picture ID: Michigan election law anticipates that **not** all those registering to vote or requesting an absentee ballot will have picture ID. Those who **do not** have acceptable picture ID or forgot to bring acceptable picture ID can register to vote or obtain an absentee ballot by signing an *Affidavit of Voter Not in Possession of Picture Identification*.

The law also now requires that Absentee Voter Ballots from voters that obtain ballots in person and sign the *Affidavit of Voter Not in Possession of Picture Identification* form **must be processed as a <u>challenged ballot</u> on Election Day.**
