

SNOW & ICE - A NOTE FROM THE VAN BUREN PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

WHAT VAN BUREN TOWNSHIP IS RESPONSIBLE FOR...

The staff of the Van Buren Public Works Department provides snow removal and salt application for all Township facilities, including the Water Tower facility, two new fire stations, two old fire station buildings, and the Historical Museum. The staff also plows snow to provide basic road access to the four Township owned cemeteries. In addition to plowing the parking lots and access roads to these properties, we work to clear the sidewalks of snow and ice to reduce potential slip and falls for the public using our buildings. This has been a particularly difficult winter, and despite our best efforts, additional time is sometimes required to clear the lots and sidewalks of snow and ice. We ask that you take extra caution throughout this season, even if a sidewalk appears clear. All home and business owners are responsible for the sidewalks adjacent to their properties.
